The National Gathering provides an opportunity to network, share education best practices, and give voice to invaluable insights and perspectives regarding *Indigenous Languages – Respecting Traditions of Interconnectedness for Taking Action toward First Nations control of education*. First Nations Directors of Education, principals, teachers, educators, Indigenous Institutes and partners in First Nations education are invited to join us and take part in FNEAA's Virtual Second Annual National Gathering!

This Gathering follows in the tradition of the Assembly of First Nations previous Nations Education Gatherings. The First Nations Education Administrators Association (FNEAA) is a new national organization incorporated on February 6, 2019. The Assembly of First Nations (AFN) through the Chiefs Committee on Education, the National Indian Education Council and Education Sector staff hosted many dialogue sessions with education administrators across the country to determine the need for and goals of the Association. In 2017, AFN Resolution 15/2017 was passed by the Chiefs in Assembly to support the creation of a national association for directors of education.

The theme of the 2022 FNEAA National Gathering is ***INDIGENOUS LANGUAGES - Creatively Respecting Traditions of Interconnectedness – Taking Action to Achieve First Nations Control of First Nations Education***. Although change is a constant in the universe, values and traditions internally remain the same. First Nations interconnectedness to the land, life, spirit, and each other influences how First Nations take action by building upon Indigenous languages, cultures and traditions to create and develop First Nations Control of First Nations Education.
